



Kim Endre Good Neighbor Award

Eligibility Criteria

Nominees must be REALTOR® members of OBAR in good standing. Their community work should include **activities within the past 12 months**, though ongoing efforts that demonstrate sustained commitment may also be considered. REALTORS® may nominate themselves or be nominated by another OBAR member or the community organization they served.

Evaluation

Nominees must have made significant personal contributions to programs that enhance the livability of local communities. Activities may address issues such as crime prevention, youth mentoring, or homelessness prevention and are not limited to real estate-related projects. Contributions of money, materials, or other resources will also be considered.

Judges will evaluate nominees based on the level and impact of their contributions, the breadth of their impact, and the project's potential to inspire other REALTORS®.

Recognition

This award recognizes individual contributions, though pairs (e.g., co-founders) may be judged as one if their efforts cannot be separated. Recipients can only be recognized once within a 12-month period, and recognition will be scheduled to avoid consecutive awards for the same organization or REALTOR® company.

Recipients will be honored at a General Membership Meeting and may also be nominated for the NAR Good Neighbor Award. OBAR will make a monetary donation on behalf of the recipient to their designated charity or non-profit organization.

Nomination Process

Nominations are reviewed on a rolling basis and may not be recognized in the order received. Nominees may be contacted before public recognition to provide photos and supporting materials. Criteria are subject to change, and decisions by the selection committee are final.
